By underground

Holborn is a 3 minute walk
(Piccadilly & Central Lines)

Tottenham Court Road is a 20 minute walk (Central and Northern Lines); (Bus: Route number 98, pay before boarding, 10 minutes)

Goodge Street is a 20 minute walk
(Northern Line)

National Rail Stations

Euston is a 25 minute walk
Tube: Take the Northern or the Victoria Line to King's Cross change to the Piccadilly Line
Bus: Route numbers 59, 68, 98 and 168, pay before boarding, 10-15 minutes

King's Cross is a 30 minute walk
Tube: Piccadilly Line

Waterloo is a 25-30 minute walk
Bus: Route numbers 521, 171, 59, 1, 68, 243 and 168, pay before boarding, 10 minutes

Charing Cross is a 20 minute walk
Tube: Take the Northern Line to Tottenham Court Road change to the Central Line
