Please allow up to 10 working days to receive your order.

Cancellation Rights: If you live in the United Kingdom or another European Union country, Iceland, Lichtenstein or Norway, you have a legal right to cancel your order after you have received and inspected the items. Please note that in the case of books and reports, "inspect" means examine, and does not permit you to fully read or otherwise use them. Please note that you are under a legal duty to take care of the items. Care should be taken to ensure that the items remain in the best possible condition. Should you decide that you do not want the items following inspection you must notify us of your cancellation in writing, by post to the address below within 7 working days of receipt of the items. Following cancellation you are under a legal duty to not use the items, and to take care of them.

You must return the items to us securely packaged, in a good condition consistent with your statutory duty to take care of them, at your own cost, by recorded delivery or by any other appropriate method so as to reasonably ensure that we receive them, as soon as possible after sending us your cancellation. We would suggest that returning the items with your cancellation notice would save you postage costs. We will refund to you, as soon as we reasonably can, and within 30 days of receiving your cancellation, the sums paid by you in relation to them.

If you do not return the goods within 21 days of your cancellation notice, we may chose to recover the goods from you, and if we do so, to charge you for the costs of doing so. We have a legal right to bring court action against you for breach of statutory duty if the items are not recovered or have not been looked after, and wherever there is evidence of fraud we refer matters to the police for criminal prosecution.
