**Poster abstract submissions are now open for the PMP SIG Conference-
11th & 12th September 2019, Bristol**

Abstracts accepted by the PMP Conference poster team will be invited to exhibit their poster throughout the Conference. All accepted abstracts will be made available as a hard copy in the Conference pack and electronically for delegates to download from the website at the conclusion of the Conference.

At the Conference, invited judges will choose the best poster, and two runners-up. Prizes will be awarded for these three posters. The conference programme will also include an integrated poster session during which these three selected poster authors will be invited to give a brief talk summarising their research and answer questions from the floor.

The deadline for abstract submission is Friday, 14th June 2019. Successful applicants will be notified no later than **Friday, 28th June 2019.**

Abstract Information

Your abstract should contain the following information:

- Title, author(s), affiliation, email address of contact author(s)
- Background - Max. 150 words
- Aims - Max. 50 words
- Methods - Max. 150 words
- Results - Max. 150 words
- Conclusion - Max. 100 words
- Conflict of Interest- Authors must declare any financial support received or any conflict of interests on their poster abstract.
- Ethical Guidelines- Abstracts must conform to the Home Office license requirements for animal research and to the International Association for the Study of Pain's ethical guidelines for animal research.
